In the second presentation of a series on the proposed 2012-2013 budget, Ms. Carney reviewed the 2% tax cap and what the tax levy means to us as a community, a review of the Board's goals that have driven this proposed budget, and a review of the proposed budgets for Facilities, Security, and Transportation.

*Preliminary 2012-2013
Budget Presentation*
-Facilities, Transportation

It is anticipated that we will receive about \$631,000 in additional state aid; however, the District now has to bear more costs in special education expenses which will mean about \$180,000 in new expenditures. Pre-school education costs have shifted from the county and state to school districts. This creates a burden to pay yet another unfunded mandate. As stated by Mr. Griffing, this is a political shell game and negates anything that would help the District...they are giving in one way and taking away in another.

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The School District has nine buildings and several subsidiary structures. A staff of more than 50 full time and part time custodians and maintenance mechanics clean and repair 697,210 square feet of District buildings and maintain nearly 200 acres of land throughout the year. Additionally, special projects, evening activities and usage of our buildings by the community require department resources.

The proposed 2012-2013 budget for Operations, Maintenance and Security is as follows and results in a grand total overall reduction of -1/15%.

Operations

Percent change of -2.58%

Maintenance

Percent change of 1.88%

Security

Percent change of 1.64%

(The 2012-2013 Budget reduces custodial staffing by 1.5 full time employee).

We are very proud that we operate our own Transportation Department with a fleet of 67 full sized buses, 28 vans and 10 wheelchair accessible vehicles as they are an integral part of the entire school day. We are recognized by the New York State DOT as "among the best" vehicle maintenance programs statewide and we are one of the largest geographic school districts in Suffolk County. School bus drivers traveled 1,420,559 miles in 2010-2011 to transport 4,821 students to seven schools, 523 students to 13 non-public schools, and 49 students to eight special education schools. Our District is leading the County in the use of propane-powered buses which use 25% of the oil used by diesel buses and burn cleaner. Our transportation mechanics not only maintain our buses but rebuild trucks and work vehicles for the maintenance department thereby saving significant dollars in purchases. The District is also experiencing a savings in the use of propane buses versus diesel because of the significant difference in cost per gallon, less maintenance with propane, and the longevity of the engines will likely be extended before needing replacement. The District is also looking at fewer bus stops to transport our students through the use of software to centralize and fairly place the bus

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stops. Ms. Carney also stated that combining the Middle School and High School students on the buses is not an uncommon configuration. Fifth and sixth grade students will be seated in the front of the bus and our Code of Conduct will be updated. The District will take a very aggressive stance with bullying to comply with the *Dignity for All Students Act*, signed into law in September 2010 to ensure that school administrators and educators have the tools and resources in place to afford all students a secure educational environment.

There is an overall reduction in Transportation of -4.95%.

Ms. Carney commented on events happening within our schools that included the following:

Opportunity for
Superintendent

- ▶ Riverhead High School Physics students placed 2nd and 3rd at the Regional level of the National Rube Goldberg Competition on February 11 at the Cradle of Aviation Museum in Garden City. They competed with teams from across Long Island and New York City and are congratulated for doing so well in this competition!
- ▶ Twenty-one out of 150 East End high school seniors received Awards of Distinction for their participation in the Parrish Art Museum's High School Exhibition.
- ▶ Lauren McDonald's second grade class at Riley is working on a school-wide recycling project where students, teachers, and staff are being asked to throw excess paper into painted green boxes that are in every classroom instead of in the trash. This project is being undertaken to help save the polar bears and we are proud of our commitment to the environment.
- ▶ The District has partnered with Suffolk County Community College to implement an Early College Program (ECP). This offers Juniors and Seniors the opportunity to earn college credits and have a real college experience at the college campus in Riverhead. Students participating in this program will pay only a third of the standard tuition and gain valuable experience as they prepare for full time college enrollment after high school.

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▶ The Riley Avenue Drama Club presented their performance of *Cinderella* on February 11. This year's performance marks the 25th anniversary of this event which performs to a packed house each and every year.

▶ Congratulations to the Girls' Basketball team and coaches for winning League title and to the Boys' Basketball team and coaches who are competing in playoffs.

▶ Six Varsity softball players won the National Fastpitch Coaches Association All American Scholar Athlete Award for the 2010-2011 school year. This award requires the players to maintain a 3.5 GPA for the entire school year. The recipients of this prestigious award are: Brittney Baron, Alexandra McKillop, Megan Weiss, Stephanie Falisi, Maria Messina, and Allison Doscinski.

▶ The *John Mendreski Memorial Student/Teacher Badminton Tournament* will be held on February 28th from 3-6 p.m. in the High School Gymnasium.

▶ Schools will be closed next week (Feb. 20-24) for Mid-Winter Recess.

Mr. Meyer reported on the latest Fundraising Committee meeting held last week when an on-line presentation was given on *PaySchools*, an online payment processing system. This system is being recommended by the New York State School Boards Association and the District is looking to implement it at the high school level as soon as possible. This system will allow us to accept secure online payments for student purchases for school related items and see significant efficiencies and savings in cash flow management and personnel time. The Audit Committee met last week with the Internal Auditor and a rough draft of their findings was reviewed and will be shared with the rest of the Board when the final paperwork is received.

Opportunity for Board Members

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Mr. Hsiang commented that the budget vote and election of school board members is coming up soon. Two seats will be expiring and anyone interested to become a candidate should contact Ms. Carney. The position is very rewarding but also a lot of work.

Mr. Falisi stated that the District hopes to keep our employees who "wear several different hats" involved once the PaySchools system is implemented.

Ms. Barbara Barosa, President of the R.C.F.A., spoke on the issue of twelve teachers and nine teaching assistants who received excess letters last Friday. She expressed hope that this process is more open and more discussion is held about how to teach our student population with twenty-one positions being cut. She asked that the Board take this under advisement and bring back these positions.

-Will the Fundraising Committee meet with PTO's and Booster Clubs? (Mr. Meyer stated that there will definitely be meetings held as they want everyone on-board by the end of the school year.)

-Are school district employees allowed to speak at Board meetings? (Per Mr. Meyer: Only residents of the District are permitted to do so. Ms. Carney offered that he could call her anytime to discuss the matter he is concerned about.)

-An employee of the Transportation Department and taxpayer of the District stated his concern of safety for about 5,400 students that are transported with 45-50-60 students on a bus.

-A parent of a child in Pulaski Street School spoke on the issues involving her son and excessive in-school suspensions. She informed the Board of the violation of her parental rights, improper procedures, and non-compliance with the Code of Conduct.

-A member of Riverhead SEPTA asked that a review of in-school suspensions at Pulaski be conducted to provide some assurances for parents.

-Request that consideration be given to revamp the proposed decision to combine bus runs for Middle School and Pulaski Street School students as it could present safety issues (*i.e.*, assigned seating on already existing overcrowded buses, monitoring behavior between older and younger students, etc.).
