Opportunity for
Superintendent

- On the Wednesday before Thanksgiving, more than 300 families participated in the Phillips Avenue Community Café where school and community members were served pancakes and participated in a heartwarming event that reminds us what life is all about.
- The Riverhead Latin Team recently participated in the 8th annual Suffolk Classical Society Declamatio hosted by SUNY Stony Brook. It was another triumph for our Riverhead Latinists who won the lion's share of prizes – seven out of 12 places!
- Congratulations to this year's recipients of the prestigious New York State Association for Health, Physical Education, Recreation and Dance – Suffolk Zone Award. They are High School Seniors – Justine Huysman and Alexander Sakhno.
- On November 20th, 45 cadets from the Riverhead NJROTC Team competed at the William Floyd Drill Meet against six other schools from New York and New Jersey. They finished First Overall in both the Varsity and First Year Cadet Division. Out of the nine events held, Riverhead came away with six first place finishes and three second place trophies.
- Mario Carerra, Jr., recently signed his letter of intent to play lacrosse for St. John's University.

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- On November 16th, motivational speaker and radio talk show host, Milton Creagh, shared a serious message on Drugs, Alcohol and Violence with the High School students. Ms. DeVito commended Debra Rodgers, Principal at the Phillips Avenue School, and staff for the fantastic job they did in contributing to the huge success of the Community I' event. She also has received letters from Mr. Densieski and the Langhorn family seeking to rename the library at Pulaski in honor of PFC Garfield Langhorn. She asked that the Board of Education consider this request at a future Board meeting. In addition, in light of the new electives approved this evening, she asked that the Board also consider expanding the foreign language program to include Madarin Chinese. This could benefit many of our young people for their future endeavors in a global economy.

Comments by Board Members

Mrs. Cotten-DeGrasse commented on the Community Café get-together where one student teacher brought her mother to work and one of the teachers brought her sister-in-law from Ohio. This is a show of real dedication.

Mr. Griffing requested the status of the safety valves at Roanoke to which Ms. Carney stated that they are in place, were re-fired yesterday at 3:15 p.m., and are being monitored around the clock.

Mrs. Lantz commented on one man who was present at the Community Café event who, when greeted and asked how he was, replied – "I am blessed." He was very genuine in his comment and the entire event ran so smoothly – it was peaceful, quiet, dimly lit, and an exceptional day.

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Mr. Falisi congratulated the cast of *Annie* for their outstanding performance. He and Mr. Meyer had attended the recent Middle School Football Award Banquet which was hosted by Head Coach, Sal Loverde. The 8th grade team went undefeated and the 7th grade team won 5 and 1 and clinched the Suffolk County Championship.

Mrs. Berezny spoke on the message that motivational speaker, Milton Creagh, recently shared with the students at the High School. His message on the impact of drugs and alcohol serves to reach teenagers and their parents and teach them the principles of a successful life. He was just phenomenal and his book, "Nobody Wants Your Child" is great. On November 13, she attended the wonderful performance of *Annie* and thanked the volunteers who perform year after year that helps benefit the scholarship fund for our district. On November 11th, she attended the Vail Levitt Theatre Concert Series, hosted by "Doc" Greenberger, which is held on the second Thursday of each month; however, the concert for December will be cancelled due to the presentation of the drama, *Stage Door*, by the High School Blue Masques on December 10, 11, and 12. The series will resume on January 13th at 7:00 p.m. at the Vail Levitt Theatre with half vocal and half instrumental.

Regrettably, Mr. Meyer was unable to attend the Community Café at Phillips but was able to attend the Blue-White Dinner for the Middle School Football Award Banquet and congratulated all the coaches and athletes. He also commended the NJROTC who got off to a great start and finished First Overall in recent competition.

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that were distributed to families of the district's large population of students who receive free and reduced lunches.
