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The Consolidated Title Grant

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- The New York State Education Department (NYSED) has developed the 2023-2024 Consolidated Application for Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) - Funded Programs to support the timely administration of ESSA - funded programs to local educational agencies (LEAs) across the state.
- The application focuses on required assurances from Section 8306 of the ESSA, as well as fiscal and programmatic information that staff have determined is necessary to properly administer each program.
- Federal Funds through ESSA are broken into several components (Titles I-IV)
- Provided annually through the NYS Education Department
- Based on District percentage of economically disadvantaged population
- Must be shared with interested in-district and out-of-district private schools who have Riverhead students that qualify based on *academic need and financial need* (Title I)
- Must be shared with interested in-district private schools based on *entire student population* from Riverhead (Title II and IV)
- Must be shared with interested in-district private schools based on Riverhead student qualification (Title III)

Title I - Part A



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- Title I Part A funding is used to support School Improvement Programs
- 2021-2022 \$894,363 / 2022-2023 \$769,943 / **2023-2024 \$898,748**
- Academic support for at-risk students (remedial reading and AIS - salary)
- Must reserve funds for parent and family engagement (translation services)
- Must reserve funds for homeless students (materials and supplies)
- Allocation to support necessary professional development and a percentage of salary and benefits of a school counselor
- Must be shared with interested in-district and out-of-district private schools who have Riverhead students that qualify based on academic need and financial need (Title I)
- All Riverhead schools are Title I designated schools

Title I - Part D



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- Title I Part D is used to support neglected and delinquent education - Timothy Hill Children's Ranch
- 2021-2022 \$64,215 / 2022-2023 \$62,478 / 2023-2024 \$97,384
- Funds are completely separate from District funds. Funds are used to carry out high quality education programs to prepare students for high school completion / career and technical training

Title II - Part A



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- Title II Part A funding is used to provide students from low-income families and minority students with greater access to effective educators
- 2021-2022 \$149,136 / 2022-2023 \$114,697 / 2023-2024 \$138,892
- Support for teachers professional development (i.e. Science 21 and NGLS)
- Building level administrator professional development
- Salary and benefits of a literacy coach at the elementary level
- Curriculum writing
- Substitute teacher costs - teacher participation in professional development
- Must be shared with interested in-district private schools based on entire student population from Riverhead

Title III & Title III Part A



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- Two components Title III & Title III Part A
- Title III funding is used to support English Language Learners (ELLs)
- Title III Part A funding is used to support Immigrant Education (Didn't receive funding)
- Title III 2021-2022 \$277,400 / 2022-2023 \$275,096 / 2023-2024 \$306,197
- Materials and supplies
- Professional development
- Programs to support ELLs (i.e. summer support / Ellevation)
- Salary and benefits for 0.5 LEAD teachers & neighborhood aides to support SIFE students
- Family engagement and support
- Must be shared with interested in-district private schools based on Riverhead student qualification

Title IV - Part A



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- Title IV Part A funds are targeted for student academic enrichment and support
- 2021-2022 \$66,441 / 2022-2023 \$65,721/ 2023-2024 \$62,167
- At least 20% of the allocation used to support safe and healthy students (SEL) / social worker salary
- Generation Citizenship Curriculum (Seal of Civic Readiness)
- Science 21 Implementation
- A portion of the allocation for activities to support effective use of technology
- Must be shared with interested in-district private schools based on entire student population from Riverhead
